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QCA Northern Ireland has a statutory remit for the regulation of NVQs in Northern Ireland and has had an office based in Belfast since 1996.

The programme of work in Northern Ireland is sponsored by the Department for Employment and Learning.

A part of this programme is to lead on e-assessment for vocational programmes and qualifications.
